### Administrators

SharePoint 2007 for Administrators  
(2 Days)  
**MSSP-135**

This course is designed to provide instruction in the principles and practices of how to deploy, manage and maintain SharePoint. The course explores each phase of a deployment: planning, installing, rolling out and supporting SharePoint in the real world.

### Developers

SharePoint 2007 for Developers  
(4 Days)  
**MSSP-130**

This course is designed to provide those who are responsible for customizing and creating new functionality with the SharePoint platform mastery of these common tasks. Students who master the contents of this course will possess the knowledge to productively contribute on most types of SharePoint implementation because they will understand the tasks and building blocks required in all types of custom solutions.

This course is designed for the SharePoint Developer looking to enhance the business experience on their SharePoint site and looking to use built-in capabilities and customize their website with SharePoint Designer, InfoPath, and Workflows.

SharePoint 2007: Portals (2 Days)  
**MSSP-165**

This course teaches all about the portal features found in Microsoft Office SharePoint Server's Standard and Enterprise versions, MOSS. After completing this course, you'll have a good understanding of the standard MOSS collaboration portal features including collaboration portals, user profiles, search, and information management policies, as well as the enterprise features including business data catalog, InfoPath forms services, and Excel services.
